### Special Course Requirements

#### a) Flexible full-time mode students

Students must be engaged in approved employment for 72 recognised weeks\* to meet the requirements for Practice Experience B. Approved employment is defined as working under the direction of an architect who is registered within the place of practice where the experience is obtained.

#### b) Full-time mode students

Full-time mode students must be able to fulfill the requirements of Practice Experience B (72 recognised weeks of approved employment) within or at the end of the last 2 years of the course. Approved employment is defined as working under the direction of an architect who is registered within the place of practice where the experience is obtained. It is not recommended that students study in full-time mode unless they have accrued at least 20 weeks of approved employment that can be counted towards ADB796 Practice Experience B prior to commencing their 4<sup>th</sup> year of study.

#### Please note:

*Students in the flexible full-time mode must enrol in ADB796 Practice Experience B in the second Semester of sixth year and students in the full-time mode must enrol in ADB796 Practice Experience B in the second semester of fifth year and will not be eligible to graduate until this unit of employment is satisfied. Updated reports on progress in employment are required from students at the end of each semester.*

### Professional Recognition

On completion of the course and one year of postgraduate practical experience, graduates are eligible to apply for membership of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects and are eligible to apply to sit for the registration examinations conducted by the Board of Architects of Queensland.

### Commencing students with Advanced Standing

Students with advanced standing (academic credit as assessed at the point of course offer) are not required to lodge an Application for Advanced Standing, as this will be awarded by QUT before the census date of your first teaching period. After being awarded this credit, you wish to apply for additional advanced standing, you are then required to lodge an Advanced Standing Application form (AS form) by the due date and subject to QUT rules <http://www.studentservices.qut.edu.au/apply/advancedstanding/details.jsp>

**Important Note: Please ensure you select the correct teaching period, class and location code for all units you are enrolled in. All units in this course have a location of Gardens Point and a class of Internal.**

**Limits on grades of 3:** A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009 (QUT MOPP C/9.2). With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a fail grade. Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes up to the maximum number of grades of 3 permitted for your course.
