## ■ Doctor of Education (ED11)

**Location:** Kelvin Grove campus

**Course Duration:** 3 ½ – 4 ½ years part time (depending on qualifications)

**Total Credit Points:** 288

**Standard Credit Points/Part-time Semester:** 24

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**Mode of Study:** Part-time (Continuing students are able to fast-track their enrolment, subject to course coordinator approval.)

### IMPORTANT COURSE SPECIFIC ENROLMENT ADVICE

Students are expected to enrol as per the standard structure outlined on this Course Summary Sheet, and are responsible for ensuring their unit selection is correct. Failure to do so may result in financial and academic penalties.

**Underloads** – it is not expected that a student should underload – i.e undertake less credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to undertake fewer units than the standard load, it may lead to difficulties in undertaking units in a timely manner later in the course.

**Overloads** – it is not expected that a student should overload – i.e undertake more credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to overload you should be aware of the possible academic consequences of an increased study load.

**Course Progression** – students should attempt to follow the standard course progression as outlined on the Course Summary Sheet. Failure to do so could result in difficulties in unit selection. It is a student's responsibility to ensure they have met pre-requisite and co-requisite requirements when they select their enrolment program.

Students who have been granted entry into the Doctor of Education without a Masters degree are required to complete 4 units chosen from the Master of Education (ED79) Course Summary Sheet. These units must be completed at a grade of 5 or better (on a 7 point scale) before commencement in the Doctor of Education program.

#### Notes for selection of units

It is vital that students select the appropriate class code on their on-line enrolment for each unit they will be undertaking.

**INT** The unit is offered internally and students attend evening lectures during the semester

**BLK** A number of days in January and/or June/July holidays, normally 9.00-4.00pm with additional days/evenings arranged throughout the semester. Students enrol in First Semester, 2009 for units that begin in January and Second Semester, 2009 for units that begin in July. Results will be released at the end of each semester of enrolment.
