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Notes for selection of units

Internet (I-NET) The unit will be conducted through the QUT Blackboard site. Students will require access to suitable computer facilities with a minimum equivalent of a Pentium 3 processor, 56K modem and Internet Access.

Internal (INT) The unit is offered internally and students attend lectures during the semester.

Block (BLK) A block of lectures held in the January or June/July school holidays, normally 9.00-4.00pm. Assessment is finalised after completion of the block lectures.

External (EXT) The unit is offered externally.

Students are expected to enrol as per the standard structure outlined on this Course Summary Sheet, and are responsible for ensuring their unit selection is correct. Failure to do so may result in financial and academic penalties.

External Mode (Unit Class Code I-NET) External study involves accessing course materials online and participating in the interactive, online learning and teaching activities prepared for you on each unit's QUT Blackboard web site.

Underloads – it is not expected that a student should underload – i.e undertake fewer credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to undertake fewer units than the standard load, it may lead to difficulties in undertaking units in a timely manner later in the course.

Overloads – it is not expected that a student should overload – i.e undertake more credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to overload you should be aware of the possible academic consequences of an increased study load.

Course Progression – It is a student's responsibility to ensure they have met any specified pre-requisite and/or co-requisite requirements when they select their enrolment program.

Limits on grades of 3 - A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009 (QUT MOPP C/9.2). With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a fail grade. Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes. Grades of 3 incurred in units that commence after 1 January 2009 will not count towards your degree. The maximum number of pre-2009 grades of 3 permitted for this course can be found [here](#).

Course Structure

The course structure requires students to complete 24 credit points of compulsory "core" units, 24 credit points of Education Electives and 48 credit points of other Elective units selected from Options 1, 2 or 3 below. Students enrol in 48 credit points of units (full-time) or 24 credit points of units (part-time/external) in each semester.

Compulsory

Students must complete four units from the Faculty of Education. These four units will include the two core units EDP415 Engaging Diverse Learners (replacing CLB306 Understanding Educational Practices) and EDP416 The Professional Practice of Educators (replacing SPB016 Teachers and the Curriculum) plus two Faculty of Education elective units. **Please note all of the units on this course summary sheet are Faculty of Education units with the exception of the one Faculty of Health units listed on page 4.**

Option 1: Students may undertake four 12 credit point units from the **Faculty of Education** elective units listed below.
