INTERNAL (INT)	Unit is taught on the Kelvin Grove campus.
EXTERNAL (EXT or EXTN)	External study involves accessing course materials online and participating in the interactive, online learning and teaching activities prepared for you on each unit's Online Learning and Teaching (OLT) website.
BLOCK (BLK)	Up to 5 days in June/July holidays, normally 9.00am-4.00 pm with the possibility of additional days arranged throughout the semester. Students enrol in Second Semester, 2008 for units that run in June. Results will be released at the end of semester of enrolment.
INTERNET (I-NET)	The unit will be conducted through the Online Learning and Teaching (OLT) site. <u>Minimum Requirement:</u> Access to suitable computer facilities with a minimum equivalent of a Pentium 3 processor, 56K modem and Internet Access.

COURSE SPECIFIC RULES

Students are expected to enrol as per the standard structure outlined on this Course Summary Sheet, and are responsible for ensuring their unit selection is correct. Failure to do so may result in financial and academic penalties.

Blue Card Requirement - Prior to commencing the Education units in this course you will be required to hold a valid Blue Card to enable you to complete the field studies requirements of the course. Blue Card applications may take up to 16 weeks to process and it is therefore essential that you ensure you submit your application for the card at least a semester before you are scheduled to undertake any field studies units.

If you do not hold a valid card at the commencement of the field studies or have not applied for a renewal within the required time frame, you will be unable to participate in the required activities and will need to be withdrawn from the unit(s). This may incur both financial and academic penalty depending on the date the application was submitted. The Faculty of Education reserves the right not to finalise field studies placements for students who fail to take appropriate action to ensure they have a current Blue Card authorized with QUT to cover every semester in which they have a Queensland-based field studies unit.

Course Information: ED43 is accredited as a full-time, internal course. Students are not permitted to undertake units in external or part-time mode unless advised to do so by the Course Mentor or by the Faculty of Education.

Overload: If you decide to undertake more units than the standard load you should be aware of the possible academic consequences of an increased study load. Students should also be aware of problems that may arise in the future with Austudy if they elect to overload. The Faculty of Education permits students to overload to 60 credit points (ie standard program plus one more unit) without Faculty approval only if their course grade point average is 4.0 or higher.

Underload: If your circumstances require you to undertake fewer units than the standard load, you may experience difficulties in undertaking units in a timely manner later in the course. Students should also be aware of potential problems with Austudy if they choose to underload. The Faculty of Education permits students to underload to 36 credit points without Faculty approval.

Course progression: Students should follow the standard course progression as outlined in the Course Summary Sheet. Failure to do so could result in difficulties in semester unit selection and timetable clashes. It is a student's responsibility to ensure that they have met prerequisite and corequisite requirements when they select their enrolment program (check QUT Handbook at www.handbook.qut.edu.au).

Eligibility for graduation - limits on grades of three: A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009 (QUT MOPP C/9.2). With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a fail grade. Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes up to the maximum number of grades of 3 permitted for your course. Grades of 3 incurred in units that commence after 1 January 2009 will not count towards your degree. The maximum number of pre-2009 grades of 3 permitted for this course can be found [here](#).

Failure of Units: Students should be aware that failure of units may result in problems with course progression. It is the student's responsibility to redeem the failed grade(s) in a manner compatible with unit availability and practicum requirements.

Maximum number of years in which to complete course: Ten (10) years.

Designated Units: At the end of each year students who have failed to achieve a satisfactory level of performance in a designated unit will be eligible for exclusion.
