Class Codes

When completing your enrolment online, you will be required to indicate the **class code** for each unit that you will be studying in 2009. The class code indicates the manner in which you are studying the unit. An explanation of the class codes that are relevant to Bachelor of Education (Secondary) Graduate students is indicated below:

- INT** Unit is taught on the Kelvin Grove campus
- EXT** Guided study through a package of printed resources
- I-NET** The unit will be conducted through the Online Learning and Teaching (OLT) site. Access to suitable computer facilities with a minimum equivalent of a Pentium 3 processor, 56K modem and Internet Access.
- BLK** One week (5 days) in summer program or June/July (Semester 2 enrolment) holidays, normally 9.00am-4.00pm with possibility of additional days arranged throughout semester (normally a weekend).

IMPORTANT COURSE SPECIFIC ENROLMENT ADVICE

Blue Card Requirement - As soon as you enter your enrolment program for the course, you must either submit your Blue Card application to the QUT Student Centre immediately, or if you already hold a valid Blue Card, submit an authorisation form to the Student Centre so that you may be registered with the Commission as a QUT student. You must hold a Blue Card that is registered with QUT to undertake activities in any unit which involves contact with children, including the required field studies blocks.

If you do not apply for a Blue Card immediately upon enrolment in the course and allow sufficient time for the police check and issuing of the Card, you will be unable to participate in the required activities and may need to be withdrawn from the unit(s) and incur both financial and academic penalty. Course Progression – students should attempt to follow the standard course progression as outlined on the Course Summary Sheet. Failure to do so could result in difficulties in unit selection. It is a student's responsibility to ensure they have met pre-requisite and co-requisite requirements when they select their enrolment program.

Failure of Units – students should be aware that failure of units may result in problems with course progression. It is the student’s responsibility to redeem the failed grade(s) in a manner compatible with unit availability and practicum requirements.

Maximum number of grades of 3 – 3

A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009 (QUT MOPP C/9.2). With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a fail grade. Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes up to the maximum number of grades of 3 permitted for your course. Grades of 3 incurred in units that commence after 1 January 2009 will not count towards your degree. The maximum number of pre-2009 grades of 3 permitted for this course can be found [here](#).
