Course Requirements: Students are required to complete 432 credit points within the integrated course. The clinical practice units require students to undertake block practicum of two or more weeks. **NSB212 Clinical Practice 2 block practicum is scheduled outside of semester and students enrolled in this unit will need to be available at this time to complete the unit.** Students will be required to wear a uniform while on clinical practice, the cost of which is approximately \$150. Students are required to provide evidence of a current first aid and cardio-pulmonary resuscitation accreditation and undergo Hepatitis B vaccination prior to undertaking clinical practice. It is also a requirement of Queensland Health that *all students* undertaking a clinical placement in a QHealth facility complete the Essentials component of the [student orientation package](#) which is available on the Queensland Health web site. Failure to do so may result in denied or delayed access to the placement. All nursing students are required to have a Blue Card prior to commencing off-campus clinical placement. Limits on grades of 3: A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009 (QUT MOPP C/9.2). With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a fail grade. Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes up to the maximum number of grades of 3 permitted for your course. Grades of 3 incurred in units that commence after 1 January 2009 will not count towards your degree. The maximum number of pre-2009 grades of 3 permitted for this course can be found [here](#).

Professional Recognition: Graduates are eligible for Nursing registration within Australia, and have been successful in obtaining registration in Britain, New Zealand and North America. This course is recognised by the Royal College of Nursing, Australia, as satisfying the academic requirements for admission as a professional member. Graduates are eligible for registration as an Exercise Scientist with the Australian Association for Exercise and Sports Scientists (AAESS). A further year is required for accreditation as an Exercise Physiologist with AAESS.

Designated units: These are units which are deemed to be critical in a student's progress in the course. At the end of each year students who have failed to achieve a satisfactory level of performance in a designated unit will be eligible for exclusion. A Faculty Academic Board may exclude the student or place them on probationary enrolment. Designated units within the B Nursing are Clinical Practice units 2 to 5. A satisfactory level of performance in a Nursing designated unit is a grade of S - Satisfactory.

Unit Enrolment and Class Allocation: There have been minor changes to the course for 2007. Continuing students should refer to the Course Changes for Continuing Students (below) to confirm their degree requirements. Once you have enrolled in your units via QUT Virtual, you may need to allocate yourself to a tutorial/laboratory for your unit/s via your QUT Virtual Class Allocation link. Commencing Students

Commencing students have been pre-enrolled in their units for the year. Students are required to accept their enrolment in these units via the on-line enrolment function in QUT Virtual. Students not undertaking one or more of these units must reject the unit(s) in question and nominate alternative units accordingly.
