### Transitional arrangements for Law units:

- If you have completed LWB138 Fundamentals of Torts but not LWB139 Select Issues in Torts you must undertake LWB139 in semester one 2009.
- If you have completed LWB236 Real Property A but not LWB237 Real Property B or LWB332 Commercial and Personal Property Law you must undertake LWB332 in semester one 2009 and LWB244 Property Law B in second semester 2009.
- If you have completed LWB231 Introduction to Public Law and not LWB235 Australian Federal Constitutional Law you must undertake LWB242 Constitutional Law in 2009.
- Students must undertake LWB435 Legal Research in Practice in lieu of LWB434 Advanced Research and Legal Reasoning.

**Early Exit or Transferring to the Bachelor of Creative Industries single degree:** You will be required to complete the relevant Bachelor of Creative Industries single degrees course structure comprising KKB101, KKB102, KKB221, KKB222, 144 credit points of mandatory Discipline units and 96 credit points of elective units (48 of these must come from outside your Discipline).

**Important Note:** Please ensure you select the correct teaching period, class and location code for all units you are enrolled in. All units in this course have a class of Internal.

**Limits on grades of 3:** A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009 (QUT MOPP C/9.2). With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a fail grade. Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes up to the maximum number of grades of 3 permitted for your course. In order to satisfy the requirements for the Bachelor of Laws component of the double degree, a student is required to complete the total number of law elective units as follows:

- For students who commenced in 2008, 2007 or 2006 – a total of 48 credit points of elective units
- For students who commenced in 2005 – a total of 24 credit points of elective units

The offering of elective units in any semester is dependent upon sufficient minimum enrolments in the unit and the availability of staff. A student may undertake up to 48 credit points of elective units offered by other QUT Faculties but limitations are imposed on the number of introductory units which may be undertaken
