Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes up to the maximum number of grades of 3 permitted for your course. The IF10 Creative Industries course structure requires you to complete:

- KKB101 Creative Industries: People and Practices (12 credit points)
- KKB102 Creative Industries: Making Connections (12 credit points)
- Twelve (12) Media and Communication Discipline Units (144 credit points)
- Two (2) Creative Industries Electives (24 credit points) – KKB175 Creative Industries Legal Issues or LWB480 Media Law are strongly recommended as one of these elective choices.

### (3) Law Elective Units

In order to satisfy the requirements for the Bachelor of Laws component of the double degree, a student is required to complete the total number of law elective units as follows:

- For students who commenced in 2008, 2007 or 2006 – a total of 72 credit points of elective units
- For students who commenced in 2005 – a total of 48 credit points of elective units

The offering of elective units in any semester is dependent upon sufficient minimum enrolments in the unit and the availability of staff. A student may undertake up to 48 credit points of elective units offered by other QUT Faculties but limitations are imposed on the number of introductory units which may be undertaken
