Cooperative Education Program

An optional one-year period of paid work experience is available to eligible full-time students. Students participating in this program enrol in INB300 Professional Practice in IT in the first semester of the program and in INB302 IT Capstone Project in the second semester of the program. The cooperative education program and its mentoring and assessment requirements make up the required contact and assessment components of both units. Eligibility criteria apply. International students are not eligible due to visa restrictions.

Part-time students who are working in a professional IT position may be able to use their current employment to meet the criteria for completing INB300 Professional Practice in IT, after completion of 168 credit points in the Bachelor of Information Technology, subject to meeting eligibility criteria. (1) Law Elective Units

In order to satisfy the requirements for the Bachelor of Laws component of the double degree, a student is required to complete the total number of law elective units as follows:

- For students who commenced in 2008, 2007 or 2006 – a total of 72 credit points of elective units
- For students who commenced in 2005 – a total of 48 credit points of elective units

The offering of elective units in any semester is dependent upon sufficient minimum enrolments in the unit and the availability of staff. A student may undertake up to 48 credit points of elective units offered by other QUT Faculties but limitations are imposed on the number of introductory units which may be undertaken

For law elective unit offerings, please see last two pages of this Course Summary Sheet.

Intermediate Level IT Electives

If you have not completed ITB008 you will need to replace it with one of the following intermediate level elective units.

Limits on grades of 3: A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009 (QUT MOPP C/9.2). With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a fail grade. Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes up to the maximum number of grades of 3 permitted for your course.
