**Underloads** – it is not expected that a student should underload – i.e. undertake fewer credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to undertake fewer units than the standard load, it may lead to difficulties in undertaking units in a timely manner later in the course. Students should also be aware of potential problems with Austudy if they choose to underload.

**Overloads** – It is not expected that a student should overload – i.e. undertake more credit points than the standard semester load. If however, your circumstances require you to overload, you should be aware of the possible academic consequences in undertaking units in a timely manner later in the course. Students should also be aware of potential problems with Austudy if they choose to overload. **Note** – Students will be expected to overload to 5 units in semester 1-4.

## **BA Course Requirements (Years 1, 2 and 3 – Semester 1)**

Students are required to complete the following components of the degree:

- ❑ **The first year requirements (eight units) which include:**
  - **HHB116** Applied Skills and Scholarship
  - **Two** Foundation Units (if you have not already completed two Faculty Foundation Units as part of the first year requirements of the BA component of the double degree) (see List A)
  - **Two to three** Course Foundation Units (see List B)
  - **Two to three** Elective Units (see List C)

**NB** – A minimum of **four** of these **eight** units must be chosen from within the BA component of the double degree.

- ❑ **One** approved BA Study Sequence of at least **96 credit points** as a First Teaching Area

**Plus**

- ❑ Approved studies of at least **48 credit points** as a Second Teaching Area

**Notes:**

- Students must ensure that **12** of the **20** units in the BA component are chosen from units offered within BA component of the double degree.
- Students who enter the course with advanced standing should discuss their enrolment with the Course Coordinator.

***Important Note: As a result of organisational changes, all the units in this course have been recoded. Most of the HUB coded units are now HHB units although some have become KWB units. Incompatible unit codes are indicated in the unit lists A-C below.***

### **Key Terms in the BA**

- **Course** – a program of study leading to an approved award
- **Unit** – a particular set of learning experiences, to which is attached a Unit Code (for example, HHB122). Most units are spread over a semester (13 weeks) and will involve three or four contact hours per week.
- **Credit Points** – units are weighted in terms of credit points. All units in the School of Humanities and Human Services are 12 credit points.
- **Foundation Units** – BA Introductory units – see List A.
- **Course Foundation Units** – units offered in the BA component of the double degree designed to introduce the approved study sequences – see List B
- **Elective Units** – units selected by students to fit into their study programs. Electives include:
  - Units selected from those offered in the BA component of the double degree to build approved study sequences
  - Units selected from general interest to enable students to complete their degree.
- **Teaching Areas** – the subject area in which a student proposes to teach.
- **Summer Program** – a third semester located between November 2008 and the beginning of Semester 1 2009. In general, fee- based units will be offered in the Summer Program.

### **Part-time Students in BA Component**

**Note:** Part-time study is only an option during the BA component of the double degree. Under current Faculty of Education requirements, the education component of this course **must** be done on a full time basis.

During the first year, BA part-time students normally enrol in **two** units.
