**Course Duration:** 4 years full-time

**Total Credit Points:** 432

**Standard Credit Pts/Full-Time Semester:** 54 (average).

**Note:** the minimum enrolment for full-time status varies each year.

#### **Course Structure:**

The Dance component of the course consists of 16 units (192 credit points): 2 Creative Industries Faculty Core Units and 14 Dance Core Units. Students are also required to complete 4 units (48 credit points) in a Second Teaching Area (STA), for example English, Film and Media, Geography, History or LOTE (French, German, Indonesian, Japanese).

Students who take Drama, Music or Visual Arts as their STA follow a slightly different progression in that they complete a total of 12 units in Dance, 2 Creative Industries Foundation Units and 6 units in their chosen STA.

The Education component consists of 16 units (192 credit points) which include 2 Dance Curriculum Studies Units and 2 STA Curriculum Studies units.

**Tutorial/Seminar/Workshop/Rehearsal Allocations:** Unless advised otherwise, students are required to self-allocate themselves to Dance seminar/tutorial/rehearsal/workshops allocations via their Student Profile in QUT Virtual. Students are **not** required to allocate themselves any Dance Technique Studies classes.

**Limits on grades of 3:** A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009 (QUT MOPP C/9.2). With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a fail grade. Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes up to the maximum number of grades of 3 permitted for your course. ## IMPORTANT COURSE SPECIFIC ENROLMENT ADVICE

Students are expected to enrol as per the standard structure outlined on this Course Summary Sheet, and are responsible for ensuring their unit selection is correct.

**Underloads** – it is not expected that a student should underload – i.e. undertake fewer credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to undertake fewer units than the standard load, it may lead to difficulties in undertaking units in a timely manner later in the course.

**Overloads** – it is not expected that a student should overload – i.e. undertake more credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to overload you should be aware of the possible academic consequences of an increased study load. A GPA greater than 4 is required to undertake an overload. Please consult the Course Coordinator.

**Course Progression** – students should attempt to follow the standard course progression as outlined on the Course Summary Sheet. Failure to do so could result in difficulties in unit selection. It is a student's responsibility to ensure they have met pre-requisite and co-requisite requirements when they select their enrolment program.

**Blue Card Requirement** - Prior to commencing the Education units in this course you will be required to hold a valid Blue Card and have that Blue Card registered with QUT to enable you to complete the Field Studies requirements of the course. Blue Card applications may take up to 16 weeks to process and it is therefore essential that you ensure you submit your application for the card at least a semester before you are scheduled to undertake any Field Studies units.

If you do not hold a valid card registered through a QUT Student Centre at the commencement of the Field Studies you will be unable to participate in the required activities and will need to be withdrawn from the unit(s). This may incur both financial and academic penalty depending on the date the application was submitted.
