Course Duration: 4 years full-time

Total Credit Points: 432

Standard Credit Pts/Full-Time Semester: 54 (average). (Note that the minimum enrolment for full-time status varies each year).

Course Structure:

The Drama component of the course consists of 16 units (192 credit points), which consists of two Creative Industries Faculty Core Units, 12 compulsory Drama core units and two electives that may be taken either in Drama or from other areas within the Creative Industries Faculty. Students are also required to complete 4 units (48 credit points) in a Second Teaching Area (STA), for example English, Film and Media, Geography, History or LOTE (French, German, Indonesian, Japanese).

Students wishing to undertake Dance, Music or Visual Arts have a slightly different progression in that they complete a total of 14 units (168 credit points) in Drama and Creative Industries units, and 6 units (72 credit points) in their chosen STA. Commencing students may choose STA's in an area other than those specified above, depending on timetable constrictions. Any such variation should be discussed first with the Drama Course Coordinator.

The Education component consists of 16 (192 credit points), which includes two Drama Curriculum and two STA Curriculum units (48 credit points).

Tutorial/Seminar/Workshop/Rehearsal Allocations: Unless advised otherwise, students are required to self-allocate themselves to *drama* seminar/tutorial/rehearsal/workshops allocations via their Student Profile in QUT Virtual. Please note that not all Faculties / Schools use the Tutorial Allocation system. Where this is the case, the tutorials are usually organised at that unit's lecture in Week 1.

IMPORTANT COURSE SPECIFIC ENROLMENT ADVICE

Students are expected to enrol as per the standard structure outlined on this Course Summary Sheet, and are responsible for ensuring their unit selection is correct.

Underloads – it is not expected that a student should underload – i.e. undertake less credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to undertake fewer units than the standard load, it may lead to difficulties in undertaking units in a timely manner later in the course. Students should also be aware of potential problems with Austudy if they choose to underload.

Overloads – it is not expected that a student should overload – i.e. undertake more credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to overload you should be aware of the possible academic consequences of an increased study load. A GPA greater than 4 is required to undertake an overload. Please consult the Course Coordinator.

Course Progression – students should attempt to follow the standard course progression as outlined on the Course Summary Sheet. Failure to do so could result in difficulties in unit selection. It is a student's responsibility to ensure they have met pre-requisite and co-requisite requirements when they select their enrolment program.

Blue Card Requirement - Prior to commencing the Education units in this course you will be required to hold a valid Blue Card and have that Blue Card registered with QUT to enable you to complete the Field Studies requirements of the course. Blue Card applications may take up to 16 weeks to process and it is therefore essential that you ensure you submit your application for the card at least a semester before you are scheduled to undertake any Field Studies units.

If you do not hold a valid card registered through a QUT Student Centre at the commencement of the Field Studies you will be unable to participate in the required activities and will need to be withdrawn from the unit(s). Maximum Number of Grades of Three: 4* **Maximum Time to Complete Degree:** 11 years
(* with a maximum of three Grades of 3 in either the discipline or education component)

Limits on grades of 3: A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009 (QUT MOPP C/9.2). With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a fail grade. Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes up to the maximum number of grades of 3 permitted for your course.
