- Students must undertake LWB435 Legal Research in Practice in lieu of LWB434 Advanced Research and Legal Reasoning.

Students who commenced in 2007 or earlier should have completed 2 Creative Industries core units (chosen from KKB007, KKB008, KKB009, KKB010 or KKB018) instead of KKB101 and KKB102.

(2) Law Elective Units

In order to satisfy the requirements for the Bachelor of Laws component of the double degree, a student is required to complete the total number of law elective units as follows:

- For students who commenced in 2008, 2007 or 2006 – a total of 72 credit points of elective units
- For students who commenced in 2005 – a total of 48 credit points of elective units

The offering of elective units in any semester is dependent upon sufficient minimum enrolments in the unit and the availability of staff. A student may undertake up to 48 credit points of elective units offered by other QUT Faculties but limitations are imposed on the number of introductory units which may be undertaken.
