COURSE STRUCTURE

The Graduate Certificate in Intelligence consists of four units of 12 credit points. This is comprised of

- One (1) Generic core unit
- Two (2) Specialist units
- One (1) Justice Elective unit

Notes:

- All units in this course are taught online/external mode of delivery (Lecture materials, Study Guide, Readings and support available via QUT Blackboard) with exception of JSN106 Analytical Methods of Intelligence which is offered in the Internal, Intensive mode of delivery – over 1 week period at Garden Point campus.
- Students have the option of selecting an Independent Study unit, available in Semester 1 or 2 as their elective unit and in consultation with the Program coordinator select a relevant topic in a chosen discipline area.
- With approval of the Course Coordinator, student may choose to undertake units offered by School of Justice, other Faculties or Universities as their Elective unit.

ARTICULATION TO POSTGRADUATE COURSEWORK NESTED PROGRAMS

Students who have successfully completed the Graduate Certificate in Intelligence with a GPA of 5.0 or better may articulate to the Master of Justice (Intelligence) and receive credit of 48 credit points towards the Masters program.

Upon successful completion of the Graduate Certificate, currently enrolled students will be invited to articulate to the Master of Justice by Student Business Services (SBS) via the QUT student email. Students who have met entry requirements for Master of Justice and wish to move to the next level of study but are not currently enrolled are required to complete the Postgraduate application form.

IMPORTANT ENROLMENT INFORMATION

Student Responsibility: You are responsible for ensuring that your enrolment is completed correctly and that your enrolment status is accurate at all times. Students should attempt to follow the standard course progression as outlined in the course summary sheet (where applicable). You are expected to abide by the University's due dates when submitting enrolment or advanced standing applications and should ensure that your address details are up to date. Units: Units are the basic components of any QUT course and are usually taught over one semester (13 weeks). Each unit has a code and title, for example: JSN101 Justice and Human Rights, **Unit Code:** JSN101
Unit Title: Justice and Human Rights

Credit Points (CP): Units are weighted in terms of credit points. Most units at QUT are worth 12 credit points. To achieve the Graduate Certificate in Intelligence students must complete **48 credit points** (4 units) in total.

Part-time Study: Students who want to study this course part-time usually enrol in 24 credit points (2 units) per semester. Part-time students should expect to complete the course in 1 year.

Underloads: Generally, it is not expected that a student should underload – ie. undertake fewer credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to undertake fewer units than the standard load this can be permitted however, it may lead to difficulties in undertaking units in a timely manner later in the course.

Overloads: It is not expected that a student should overload – ie. undertake more credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to overload you should be aware of the possible academic consequences of an increased study load.

Course Progression: Students should attempt to follow the standard course progression as outlined in the Course Summary Sheet. Failure to do so could result in difficulties in unit selection.

Attendance Mode, Location and Class Code: You are required to enrol in the attendance mode and type as specified in the University's letter of offer. It is your responsibility to ensure correct location and class codes are entered on your enrolment form as incorrect or missing information may lead to enrolment difficulties. To enrol as an external student, please use the class code of EXT for each unit you wish to take in external mode.
