CURRICULUM REVIEW

In 2006 the School of Justice reviewed its undergraduate programs with a revised curriculum introduced in Semester 1, 2007. This document will assist new students, and continuing students who commenced prior to 2007, in the selection of a study program in the transitional phase of the new version of the course. Continuing students who are unsure of their enrolment pattern should seek advice on course progression to ensure enrolment satisfies course completion.

COURSE STRUCTURE – FULL PROGRAM

This course consists of twenty-four (24) units - a total of 288 credit points. This comprises of:

- ❖ Nine (9) Justice Core Units (108 credit points) comprising:
 - 8 Justice first year core units (JSB171, JSB172, JSB173, JSB174, JSB175, JSB176, JSB177, JSB271)
 - 1 Justice final year core unit (JSB371).
- ❖ Six (6) Primary Major Units (72 credit points). Primary majors are available in either:
 - Criminology; OR
 - Policing
- ❖ Six (6) Secondary Major Units (72 credit points). Select one of the following majors:
 - Criminology
 - Policing
 - Law
 - Information Technology
 - Psychology
- ❖ Three (3) Elective Units (36 credit points).
 - Justice units
 - Non-Justice units

Notes:

- Primary Majors can be selected in Year 2 and Secondary Majors can be selected in Year 3 of the course.
- Students who undertake both majors in the School (Criminology and Policing) must select Justice Units not previously completed in their Primary Major.
- Students can only take a maximum total of 8 units (96CP) outside of the School. Therefore students undertaking a secondary major in Law, IT or Psychology will only be allowed to undertake 2 non-justice elective units.
- A maximum of two electives (24 CP) may be undertaken cross-institutionally.
- IT units are offered at Gardens Point campus in internal mode of study only.
- Psychology units are offered at Kelvin Grove campus in internal mode of study only.
- Continuing students should refer to the Justice Unit Equivalent list at the end of this document to check for incompatible units which may have been completed in a previous version of the course.

ADVANCED STANDING FOR TAFE DIPLOMA OF JUSTICE OR JUSTICE ADMINISTRATION

Students who have completed a Diploma of Justice or Justice Administration from TAFE are eligible for 8 units (96 credit points) of Advanced Standing towards their Bachelor of Justice course. Those students who have been granted 96 credit points of Advanced Standing for their Diploma are not required to select a secondary major as the 8 units are granted as unspecified exemption as Elective units. Therefore to satisfy course requirements these students will only need to complete 192 credit points = 16 units. Those units consist of 9 compulsory Justice Core units, 6 Primary Major units and 1 Justice Elective unit.

IMPORTANT ENROLMENT INFORMATION

Student Responsibility: You are responsible for ensuring that your enrolment is completed correctly and that your enrolment status is accurate at all times. Students should attempt to follow the standard course progression as outlined in the course summary sheet (where applicable). You are expected to abide by the University's due dates when submitting enrolment or advanced standing applications and should ensure that your address details are up to date. Failure to do any of the above may result in financial and academic penalties, and difficulties in unit selection.

Pre-requisite and Co-requisite Units: Students must ensure they have met any pre- and/or co-requisite requirements before undertaking units. For unit information visit https://qutvirtual.qut.edu.au/portal/pls/portal/unout_search_p.show_public

Units: Units are the basic components of any QUT course and are usually taught over one semester (13 weeks). Each unit has a code and title, for example: JSB171 Justice and Society:

Unit Title: Justice and Society

Units that are offered in Internal (INT) mode of study usually involve three to four contact hours per week, plus approximately eight hours per week of independent study. Contact hours may consist of a weekly 2 hour lecture in a large theatre plus a smaller weekly 1 hour tutorial group, or a three hour long tutorial group (lectorial), or a different combination of classes. More information on the unit can be found in the relevant Unit Outline.

Credit Points (CP): Units are weighted in terms of credit points. Most units at QUT are worth 12 credit points. To achieve the Bachelor of Justice students must complete **288 credit points** (24 units) in total.

Full-time Study: Students who want to study the Bachelor of Justice full-time usually enrol in 48 credit points (4 units) per semester. Full-time students should expect to complete the course in 3 years.

Part-time Study: Students who want to study the Bachelor of Justice part-time usually enrol in 24 credit points (2 units) per semester. Part-time students should expect to complete the course in 6 years.

Underloads: It is not expected that a student should underload – ie. undertake fewer credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to undertake fewer units than the standard load, it may lead to difficulties in undertaking units in a timely manner later in the course. Students should also be aware of potential problems with Centrelink if they choose to underload.

Overloads: It is not expected that a student should overload – ie. undertake more credit points than the standard semester load. If, however, your circumstances require you to overload you should be aware of the possible academic consequences of an increased study load. Students should also be aware of problems that may arise in the future with Centrelink if they elect to overload. Commencing Students are not permitted to overload in their first semester of study.

Course Progression: Students should attempt to follow the standard course progression as outlined in the Course Summary Sheet. Failure to do so could result in difficulties in unit selection. It is a student's responsibility to ensure they have met pre-requisite and co-requisite requirements (where applicable) when they select their enrolment program.

Attendance Mode, Location and Class Code: You are required to enrol in the attendance mode and type as specified in the University's letter of offer. It is your responsibility to ensure correct location and class codes are entered on your enrolment form as incorrect or missing information may lead to enrolment difficulties. To enrol as an external student, please use the class code of EXT for each unit you wish to take in external mode.

Eligibility for Graduation: A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009. With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered as a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a **fail** grade. Any grades of 3 awarded **prior to 1 January 2009** will retain the conceded/low pass status and only a maximum of three grades of "3" will be counted towards your Bachelor of Justice course completion.

Maximum time to complete degree: 10 years

Advanced Standing: Advanced Standing Applications must be submitted by the due date as delays may cause enrolment difficulties. Students are advised to enrol in the standard program until the success of any advanced standing application is known. After receiving advanced standing, students should seek advice from Course Coordinator before altering their enrolment program.
