Course Notes

- **Note for commencing external students only:** All commencing external students, who are undertaking law units for the first time, are required to attend a compulsory Orientation Program. Assessment will be undertaken at this program.
- **Note for all external students:** External students are required to attend a compulsory External Attendance School (held over a 3 day weekend) in each semester of study. Assessment may be undertaken at this school.
- **Change of Attendance Mode:** Students wishing to change attendance mode from internal to external **must** do so in writing to the Senior Administration Officer (Postgraduate Programs) prior to the commencement of semester. Applications received after this time will not normally be considered.
- **Online enrolment** programs may be subject to Law School approval.
- **Class Code:** All units are offered in Internal and External mode. When enrolling, please ensure you enrol in the correct class code for how you want to study, ie. Internal students should use the class code 'INT' and External students should use the class code 'EXT'.
- Students are responsible for managing their study commitments and are therefore expected to adjust their study load in accordance with their work and/or personal commitments. Concessions such as extensions, special consideration etc. will not be accommodated on the grounds of inability to meet these commitments.
- **Assignment Extensions and Special Consideration Requests, etc:** Please note, all requests for extensions and special consideration, etc. are processed by the Postgraduate Administration Staff in the Law School.
- **Underloads:** **Domestic** students are permitted to underload without approval. **International** students should contact the Postgraduate Administration Staff, on phone 3138 2981/ 3138 2305 or email: lawpg_enquiries@qut.edu.au
- **Class Allocations:** Students are required to self-allocate themselves to tutorials and lectures via their Student Profile in QUT Virtual. Please refer to the Law School website at <http://www.law.qut.edu.au/study/current/enrolment/tutorial/> and notice boards for further information.
- **Limits on grades of 3:** A new policy concerning grades of 3 comes into effect from 1 January 2009 (QUT MOPP C/9.2). With effect from this date grades of 3 will no longer be considered a conceded or low pass but will be classified as a fail grade. Any grades of 3 awarded prior to 1 January 2009 will retain the conceded pass status and will be counted for graduation purposes up to the maximum number of grades of 3 permitted for your course. Grades of 3 incurred in units that commence after 1 January 2009 will not count towards your degree. The maximum number of pre-2009 grades of 3 permitted for this course can be found [here](#).

Moving Between Courses

Domestic Students in the Graduate Certificate in Legal Studies (LW65) upon successful completion of the course will be invited, via your student email address, to continue with the next stage of the program in the following teaching period. If you accept the option to articulate **immediately** you will not be required to apply for academic credit from the lower award study, as units and grades achieved in the lower award will be automatically transferred to the new course.

Important Note: please ensure you select the correct teaching period, class and location code for all units you are enrolled in. All units in your course have a Location code of GP. Students undertaking units in full-time or part-time mode should enrol using the class code 'INTERNAL'. Students undertaking units in the external mode should enrol using the class code 'EXTERNAL'.
